



**Patricia J. Bauer, Ph.D.**, is Asa Griggs Candler Professor of Psychology and senior associate dean for research at Emory University's College of Arts and Sciences. Previously she was on the faculty of the Institute of Child Development at the University of Minnesota and on the faculty of Duke University. She studies the development of memory from infancy through young adulthood using behavioral, narrative, eye tracking, and electrophysiological measures. She is especially interested in developments in episodic and autobiographical memory and in the productive processes responsible for the extension of semantic memory. Her research is focused primarily on typical development although she also has examined the development of memory in theoretically interesting special populations, including infants with prenatal iron deficiency. She has published more than 175 articles, chapters, reviews, and books. Her work is supported by the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD), and she is director of a National Institutes of Health (NIH) predoctoral training program on Mechanisms of Learning Across Development and Species. She received her Ph.D. from Miami University and was a postdoctoral fellow at the University of California, San Diego.
