



**Paul M. Coates, Ph.D.**, is the director of the Office of Dietary Supplements (ODS) at the National Institutes of Health (NIH). He oversees a range of initiatives and programs that support research and the training of investigators and lead to the development of information resources and tools. Prior to his tenure at ODS, Dr. Coates was deputy director of the Division of Nutrition Research Coordination (DNRC) at the National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases (NIDDK), NIDDK's program director for the Type 2 Diabetes Research Program, and project officer for the multi-center clinical study known as Epidemiology of Diabetes Interventions and Complications. He also was involved in career development and fellowship training in the Division of Diabetes, Endocrinology, and Metabolic Diseases. Prior to his career at NIH, Dr. Coates was on the faculty of the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine as a research professor in the Departments of Pediatrics and Biochemistry/Biophysics. He received his Ph.D. in human genetics from Queen's University in Canada and postdoctoral training in the Department of Human Genetics and Biometry at University College London.
